AUSSIE GEMS DANCE, GYMNASTICS & CHEERLEADING GENERAL CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

As a member of Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading, or a person required to comply with the Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading Member Protection Policy you must meet the following requirements regarding your conduct during your involvement with Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading, Gymnastics NSW, Gymnastics Australia, or another affiliated club.

- 1. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- 2. Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealings with others.
- 3. Be professional in, and accept responsibility for, your actions.
- **4.** Make a commitment to providing quality service.
- **5.** Be aware of, and maintain an uncompromising adhesion to, Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading' standards, rules, regulations, and policies including this Policy, regarding appropriate physical contact with children.
- 6. Establish and maintain an environment that is safe for the conduct of activities and for children;
- 7. Listen and respond to the views and concerns of children, particularly if they are telling you that they or another child has been abused and/or are worried about their safety or the safety of others
- **8.** Promote the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of First Nations people (for example, by never questioning a child's Indigenous self-identification)
- Promote the cultural safety, participation, and empowerment of participants from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds (for example, by having a zero tolerance of discrimination)
- **10.** Promote the safety, participation, and empowerment of participants with a disability (for example, during personal care activities)
- 11. Promote the safety, participation and empowerment of participants who identify as LGBTQIA+
- 12. Do not use your involvement with Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading to promote your own beliefs, behaviours or practices where these are inconsistent with those of Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading, Gymnastics NSW and Gymnastics Australia.
- **13.** Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with persons under 18 years of age, as your words and actions are an example.
- **14.** Avoid unaccompanied and unobserved activities with persons under 18 years of age, wherever possible.
- 15. Ensure as far as practicable that adults are not left alone with a child

- **16.** Report any child safety concerns or allegations of child abuse and ensure any allegation is reported to the police or child protection agency.
- 17. If an allegation of child abuse is made, ensure as quickly as possible that the child(ren) are safe
- **18.** Encourage children to 'have a say' and participate in all relevant organisational activities where possible, especially on issues that are important to them.
- **19.** Understand the repercussions if you breach, or are aware of any breaches of, this code of behaviour.
- 20. Refrain from any form of harassment of others.
- 21. Refrain from any behaviour that may bring GA, a Member Association or an affiliated club into disrepute.
- 22. Provide a safe environment for the conduct of the activity.
- 23. Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.
- **24.** Be a positive role model.
- **25.** Understand the repercussions if you breach, or are aware of any breaches of, this code of behaviour.

In addition, members of the Aussie Gems Dance, Gymnastics & Cheerleading community must not:

- 1. Shame, humiliate, oppress, belittle, or degrade any person, particularly children;
- 2. Unlawfully discriminate against any child including because of culture, race, ethnicity, or disability;
- 3. Engage in open discussions of a mature or adult nature in the presence of children;
- 4. Engage in any activity with a child that is likely to harm them physically or emotionally;
- 5. Initiate unnecessary physical contact with a child, or do things of a personal nature for them that they can do for themselves;
- **6.** Be alone with a child unnecessarily and for more than the shortest possible time;
- 7. Develop a "special" relationship with a specific child for their own needs;
- 8. Show favouritism to children through the provision of gifts or inappropriate attention;
- **9.** Arrange contact, including online contact, with children outside the organisation's programs or activities;
- 10. Have contact with children under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.
